Purpose and objectives

Purpose

- To align and build consensus with government officials, thought leaders and industry groups to address the crisis impacting millions of people with mental illness and addictive disorders who end up in jail

Objectives

- Gain agreement this is a healthcare issue
- Propose a shared accountability model
- Alignment and consensus of thought leaders and stakeholders using the Sequential Intercept Model
- Building consensus on healthcare and law enforcement strategies at each stage of the intercept
- Continued dialogue and initiatives
- Develop insights and content for publication and presentation to be shared

Summary and next steps

- A day and a half event driven by the thoughts, ideas, perceptions, expertise and experiences of each of the attendees in their local behavioral health system or at a national policy level.
- Using the Sequential Intercept Model as a framework, participants began identifying gaps in the healthcare system and formulating healthcare and community solutions to fill those gaps. Develop the right healthcare solutions at Intercept O.
- Identified areas to begin working on in order to address this crisis affecting millions of people throughout the U.S.
